I wanted to share with you a neat and encouraging story that happened to me this last month. I've been working with the **LightShine** team in the Tarahumara community in **Chihuahua City**. We have been seeing really cool fruit that God is bringing about. One **Tarahumara** man in particular has accepted **Christ** as his savior and has been faithfully pursuing **God** personally as well as with his family. Two of his girls are in the LightShine program.

One day after the men's Bible study at church, I was giving him and a few others rides home. We were talking about the Bible study, and in a sense simply making small talk. We began discussing situations in our city and the dangers and how it all related to the devil's strategy. We all agreed that even though these things are challenging to live in, it's ultimately encouraging because it means that Jesus is coming back soon. I looked back and asked him what his opinion was about these things. He sat and thought for a minute, then very calmly and steadily he answered. "Yes, Jesus is on the path... this is why more people in my community really need to hear His news, before time is finished". **I was reeling with emotions at his response. First of all, what "Jesus is on the path" means in his culture... if someone was on the path toward your house, that meant they were FOR SURE coming to your house, and WOULD BE THERE SOON.** They are very attentive to this fact because in their culture you don't go up and knock on someone's door, you simply walk down the path toward their house... make some noise so if someone is home, if they haven't noticed you were coming already, they would come out and welcome you. I was also blown away at his heart in the fact that the rest of his community needed to hear this news... God is growing a heart of evangelism for his neighbors already!! How awesome is that!!

***Please continue praying for these guys, the Tarahumara Indians. God is moving, He is coming, and I know He has a HUGE heart for these people... yet we have such a long way to go. Lord, please break down the strongholds that have held this people group for so many generations. Please raise up a heart for seeking your face within them, and cause a wildfire to spread out from this community. Your perfect will be done. ***

July – August trip “highlights” recap:

Thursday 7/15/10 4pm

This trip is off to an “interesting” start!

Preparing to head **through the middle of Juarez** to get some help from a friend of a friend of a friend who has a friend who specializes in automotive AC.



Friday 7/16/10 1pm

When we got to the AC mechanic and started it up, the belt started smoking!! - we got to the shop just in time!

The pastor we have connected with here also has a **Bible School!** They have been looking to try to get started with doing **puppet theater** for children. Do you know of any puppets available? Or a good source of recordings in Spanish to use for puppets? (They are an out-reaching congregation and especially enjoy working with children in the mountains of **Durango.**)

Sunday 7/18/10 10am

After getting several vehicle issues taken care of, we finally made it to El Terrero last night! This trip has been rather tiring and trying already; especially for Susie.

Thank you for continuing to pray with us that we will walk in God's perfect will!

Thursday 7/22/10 12pm

Feeling the pressures of the opposition as we are simply trying to take care of some basic things (like packing, cleaning, planning) and preparing for the team to arrive on Saturday. (Seems like there's still too much to do and not nearly enough time.)

10pm

Barely made it to Madera this evening. The alternator went out of the Ford cargo van.

Saturday 7/24/10 10am

Grace Place team reporting: “**issues @ border with trailers, PRAY!**”

1pm

They are having trouble getting the vehicle and trailer permits. They’ll probably try again later today to get the permits for the vans and only one trailer. If they succeed, they should be able to try the border crossing again - first thing in the morning.

Sunday 7/25/10 8am

The team is at the border again - trying to get the permits.

Thank you for praying with us that all will go well (and quickly).

9am

They got the permits and the declaration of the contents of the trailer done, and are **on their way from the border**. Pray the rest of the journey goes well; we’re scheduled to participate in a parade this evening!



Friday 7/30/10 8pm
(lightly edited snippets from a letter by **Pastor Kim**)

Dear Prayer Friends,
Thank you so much for praying for us. You should see what has been accomplished around town through God using us. It is incredible to finally see all the **concrete poured** at the church, the **fence painted** at the park, over **250 kids** ministered to at VBS, **16** ladies at the last health clinic, an **orphanage** of children loved on, and many more things. **PRAISE GOD!** Most of the of the team is at the camp and the hot springs. I have talked to them on the CB radio and they have had a great day. Michael said it took them 2 hours to get through the muddy roads, but once they got there it was great.

I would like to take a second to say **thank you to Michael Mizer** for being a great team-lead. I have been on 11 mission trips and I think this one has to be my favorite next to St. Croix and Africa. :)

11pm

We've had **so much** going on!

The team is planning to head north in the morning.

(A few of us will be staying here in Madera a bit longer; working on some more stuff around the church and then helping **Pastor Juan Carlos' family with the move** to Guachochi. We plan to stop by the **Fiesta Tarahumara in Napuchis** along the way.)

Sunday 8/1/10 4pm

(The Grace Place team returned to Colorado today.)

As of today, the Madera church is "officially" turned over to **Pastor Esteban**.

(Last night we were invited to a celebration of 45 years in ministry for another pastor in the region. Juan Carlos and Yanira sang a special song, Pastor Esteban shared the main message!) [He's an Excellent speaker!]

Tuesday 8/3/10 10pm

Pray for **Juan Carlos and his wife Yanira** as they have been having some stomach issues. Also, **Nancy Jinnette** is here with us and she too is recovering from a stomach bug. (**Susie** has recovered from her "bout with the bug".)

We still don't know for sure what our housing situation will be here in Mexico in the near



future. We should have a better idea within the next several days. Please pray for God's PERFECT WILL to be done. (It's probable that the sale of the house which we have been using in El Terrero will be finalized on Thursday and we will have to move all our things out within the next few weeks. We're not certain where we'd move everything to, but if we need to do so, we trust God will open the doors and make it clear.) We still haven't been able to see the interior of the two little rooms in Cuatrocientos which is supposed to be available for us to use, but we should have access to it next week. (There's another place there in Cuatrocientos where we might be able to leave extra equipment and things, but we're not sure yet about it either.)

Sunday 8/8/10 10pm

The news of the day is that we do indeed **need to move** out of this house in El Terrero as soon as possible! (Within a week or two!)

Mario is still in Colorado; supposedly with the keys to the place(s) in Cuatrocientos which are supposed to be available for us. (Pray that Mario and his wife's health issues will be taken care of so they can return soon.)

Pray for us as we have had a busy time here and have so much more to do yet (packing, moving, and working on some more things in both in **Madera**, and for **Reto**).

Please pray especially for **Susie and Josiah** - Susie is feeling exhausted, and Josiah has been unusually whiny at times (especially today). It seems most of us had a bit of "bad water" symptoms recently, but I believe we're all over that now. Josiah may be dealing with feeling unsettled - in all the traveling we've been doing (especially recently).

Friday 8/13/10 11am

Still in Mexico for a while. Trying to get our things packed up and moved and still having issues with where we've been planning to move to (on the north side of Madera).

Saturday 8/14/10 5pm

(clippings [lightly edited] from a letter by **Nancy Jinnette**)

Dear Friends,

The first thing I want to mention is the fact that I never felt afraid or threatened in any way at any time on the trip. Along the way, we connected with several other teams and they all had the same peace. The atmosphere in **Madera** and other small towns where we visited seemed to be fairly normal – kids out playing and people walking on the streets after dark, restaurants full, locals “dragging main” on weekends. My understanding is that things are much more intense in **Juarez**. I’m not minimizing the fact that there is danger, but the people from other teams too, like those from Grace Place, are taking a stand of refusing to be intimidated.

On Wednesday, we helped Juan Carlos and Yanira pack; on Thursday, we started toward Guachochi and spent some time at the **Fiesta Tarahumara in**





Napuchis en route. I'm generally not a "big event" person, but it was wonderful to see so many **Raramuri** in the crowd at the Fiesta. That night, we slept at the **Mexico Medical Mission hangar**. I woke up in the middle of the night and began to think about the group of people gathered under that roof. There was Mark (the pilot) and his wife (a **Mexican** doctor), Dave (the mechanic), his **Tarahumara** wife, and their baby. Those of us traveling together were: Juan Carlos

(from **Vera Cruz**) and Yanira (from **El Salvador**) who met in **Guatemala** (and their two sons); Tano (a **Mexican** who works at Huapoca), his **Pima** Indian wife, and their little boy; Nelder (born and raised in **Madera**); and the Alms, and I who are pretty much "white bread" other than the fact that Josiah was born in **Mexico**. (And, by the way, Esteban, the new pastor at Madera, is from **Peru**.) It made me think that this must be what it's like in heaven – people from every tribe and tongue and nation **worshipping God with one heart and purpose**. (During the trip, the couple other teams we connected with were also multi-national.) My impression is that the groups of people who God sends to bless the Raramuri are comprised the best of what the Church is supposed to be. They tend to be adventurers, frontiers people, pioneers whose focus is the empowering and betterment of Raramuri both in this life and for eternity and who aren't concerned with their own comfort, safety and material possessions. **Timothy and Susie** certainly fit this picture.

It was such a joy to watch Timothy, who was absolutely in his element, and Susie who delights in supporting him. He has a consistent huge grin on his face; I'm sure some of it is the joy of doing what he loves to do surrounded by his family after all the years he waited to be a husband and father. He's a consummate networker, and the connections that he makes between people tend to be very mutually beneficial. At one point, Susie said "I think my husband is part Mexican." I could think of a number of ways this could apply, but when I asked her what she meant, she said, "Because he wants all of his friends to meet his other friends." A while later, I asked her how long it would take to get from **Guachochi to El Terrero**, and she said, "**It depends on how many people we stop to visit along the way.**"



Part of my reason for continuing to Guachochi was to get better acquainted with Juan Carlos and Yanira. Over the past two weeks, I've watched them orchestrate a Bible school for more than **300** children, help host a team of **27**, plan several large events to honor Esteban, be sick twice, pack all their possessions, and move into uncharted waters. In the midst of all this pressure, I never saw them be anything but kind, loving, and patient with each other, their chil-

dren, and everyone around them.

I absolutely fell in love with Guachochi. **Guachochi** is a Raramuri word: “**place of the herons**“ (“**garzas**” in Spanish). (I’m a real bird-lover.)The fact that I find the Guachochi region beautiful and appealing doesn’t necessarily mean that I’m to minister there, but I realize that the Father has been very gracious to me, knowing that he made me to be an outdoors person, and has allowed me to live and minister in many naturally beautiful settings throughout my life – “**The lines have fallen for me in pleasant places.**” (Ps. 16:6) (See www.guachochi.com.mx)

As for prayer requests: ***

***Every time we go to **Mexico**, Mike and I are stirred with a desire to be released into having more time to do the things we love to do together. We’re very grateful for the work Mike has, but it occupies most of his time so that I end up getting both most of the pleasure and the responsibilities of being involved in the ministry.

***Timothy and Susie – the lovely home where they lived rent-free in El Terrero has been sold, and they’ve been offered two rooms in a house where they would share a bathroom with another couple. There seem to be problems with them gaining access to this house. My heart is led to pray that God has something better for them.

Sunday 8/22/10 11pm

Got our things stored at our new location; plan to return and work on it in **November**.

Tomorrow we plan to see **Rafa and Zuri** briefly in the morning; see **Pastor Esteban**, and then head for the border. (We plan to spend some time there doing some visiting, resting, designing, and building.

Tuesday 8/24/10 7pm

Back in the **US**; we’ll be on the border for a few days, working on things here. One of the main projects is designing and building a **sewing cabinet/table** prototype which is to be copied and built by the guys in a men’s rehab program for the ladies in the women’s rehab sewing class. (We’re near **Juarez** - one of the “most dangerous” communities.) Thanks for continuing in prayer with us!

Excerpts from a letter from our friends Nolan & Marie:

Jorge and Luz were some of **Servant Senders'** first students. It has been exciting to see the growth and change in three years. Jorge loves Jesus and his heart's desire is to see others come to know our savior. At the end of his second year with



us he became a director of a rehab center. God used this to grow and shape him. When the drug wars began and the rehab centers were attacked, many closed due to lack of funds and the economy. He left the rehab and continued with his classes and discipling new converts. When he graduated from our training, Life-light (a ministry from South Dakota) asked him to come on staff and be their pastor in Mexico. With them behind him and the Lord before him, he started a small church with local kids in his home. In February, the door opened for him to rent a place and officially begin a church. The Lord is blessing his work and his family. Recently while ministering to the families at a couple of funerals, he led **four** people to the Lord at one funeral and **ten** at another. He is headed to **Haiti** on a short term trip and so excited to minister in a foreign land. He was crying when he picked his girls up from school the other day and his wife asked why. He said, "I remember when Nolan said one day maybe **Servant Senders** would go international, and here I am. God is using me to spread his word to the broken hearted, internationally!" His family has had their fair share of attacks and kidnap attempts, **but God** has intervened. Please keep them in your prayers.

Isaias is one of **Servant Senders'** teachers who goes twice a week to pray with the soldiers guarding two different military bases. So far he has seen **fourteen** soldiers, while in full dress uniform, holding AK-47's crying and accepting Jesus as their Savior. He needs a van to transport these guys to a place to have a Bible study off base.

We are staying safe by the **Grace of God and your prayers**. Please continue to pray! Feel free to copy and pass this around, the more that know what is going on in Juarez the better and more prayer is always a good thing.

S.O.M. Ministry needs continue to include the following items (or funds to purchase them) — laptops, school supplies, toys, blocks, VBS material, Bibles, and audio Bibles.

OUR MISSIONARIES —*Timothy, Susie, Josiah, and Grace* need increased financial provision, particularly for basic living costs and to fix up and make the needed repairs at the house where they will be living while they're in Mexico. **Do consider what The Lord would have you do to increase our blessings for these always-faithful servants of God and the Mexican people!**

Although funds have been rather slim, here's a growing list of some of the other gifts they've been really blessed



with: a juicer (high quality & efficient, with other options); a pop-up camper trailer; a two person (12') sail boat (& trailer); a couple thousand dollars worth of vehicle work for about 10%; a 10x12 storage shed; a small hot tub (& wood fired water heater for it); some tools; & a bunch of apples! THANK YOU! THANK YOU!! THANK YOU!!!

A quick note from Pastor Clay: Remember this: the word “**safe**” is only in the Bible **47** times; but the word “**faith**” is found **412** times. I'm praying for your safety, but more for your faith, for your testimony, for your courage, and for your impact. Stay Christ-dependent in all things!

Many areas of Mexico have become more and more affected by the impact of the drug trade. Those involved wage war against one another over the lucrative business which sees over **40 billion** dollars a year coming from the US alone. (That's right up at the top of the list of income sources for the entire country, beside oil, remittances and tourism. The Mexican military however, is only one tenth as well funded.) Many of the ministries we work with deal with the direct affects of the fact that the region has been overrun by the drug trade. **However; God is using this as a stirring wake-up call, and the Church is beginning to RISE UP.**

Daña:

Recently Daña has been able to receive some further education through some special courses; learning more about ministering effectively with the children she oversees at the albergue in **Corareachi**. We were also able to finally take her a new **laptop** for use in her ministry! (She also helps with monthly teaching of the **Raramuri pastors at the Bible Institute**.) She greatly appreciates and needs our continued support -especially in **prayer!**

A note with some requests from Kate:

I often have even the newest girls in 2 or more classes each week. Any and all **yarn and crochet hooks** would be greatly appreciated. Our scissors are all in need of replacements.

How about **funds** for a playground set, picnic table and some landscaping? I have been praying for Reto's ability to entertain our families on Sundays, and it would do wonders for our "curb appeal". -Not to mention **little Sammy** needs the play space along with a safe place to ride a **tri-cycle or something**.

My even bigger and more important dream is for a large scale **water purification** system. This need speaks for itself. The girls need to drink lots of water, especially during the de-tox stage. The water tastes so bad (because it IS bad) that they only drink it with kool-aid or if it is very cold. There are many stomach and colon problems that would be alleviated with plain old drinking water. I bring two 5-gallon jugs of the good stuff each week for my classroom. I give a treat of plain good water to each girl who shows up to **English class** with her bottle. Every little bit helps.

Also- any little thing that I can give away as a prize for **scripture memory** and such. Candy, make-up, nail files, Christian music CDs, new socks. You'd be surprised how much easier it is for a girl to memorize scripture when there are treats involved. (I save the big prizes for the end of the month when I ask them to recall as many as possible -- it's



amazing what a **little** incentive can do! No nail polish please -- the new girls sniff it.)

We finally made it to eBay. Our little **Proverbs 31** quilting class at **Reto a la Juventud** (Teen Challenge, Juarez) has listed a quilt and 5 aprons. But the competition is steep with people who have sold many thousands and have lots of positive feedback. Your prayers would be greatly appreciated. Remember 100% of the money from sales and donations goes to this very successful,

Christ centered drug and alcohol rehab center for ladies of all ages in **Juarez**. To look at the aprons, use the key words: **Teen Challenge Apron**.

Thanks again for all your support. **God is working mightily through you!** One day we hope to pay Reto's bills. For now we hope to at least begin supporting the classes themselves and pitch in on the utility bills. We likely use more electricity than any other class at Reto.

The church is outgrowing its building quickly and waiting for the Lord to bring in the money for an auditorium on the Reto property that would be used for church, community programs, and giving breakfast to neighborhood children
- 2) **Sewing machines and cabinets** for Reto's highly successful sewing and quilting program
- 3) **3-6 irons** for sewing program

- 5) **Washer and dryer** for men's program

SEATS & SHOE BOXES -- CHRISTMAS BLESSINGS *for MEXICO!!*

Through November 14th, you have a number of opportunities to bless ministries and people in the state of Chihuahua:

SHOE BOXES – we are encouraging you to each fill a small gift box for distribution by **Iglesia Jesus el Salvador** to the children in the sierra (including Tarahumara [Raramuri] children) in Guachochi. **Either use your own box or pick up one or more *Blessing Boxes* at Vinelife or SOM; fill and return to us by Nov 7th so we can take and deliver them during our November trip. Please see Oksana's wonderfully inspiring story at <http://tinyurl.com/Oksana-s-story> , and the instructional video at <http://tinyurl.com/box-instructions> (these videos are made by Samaritans Purse). If you'd like to help us with the costs of transportation that would be wonderful too!**

In order to pack a Blessing Box, first determine whether your gift will be for a boy or a girl, and the child's age category: 2-4, 5-9, or 10-14. (Please label the top of your box accordingly.) Then simply fill it and wrap it. [Here are some ideas: small cars, balls, dolls, stuffed animals, kazoes, harmonicas, yo-yos, jump ropes, small Etch A Sketch®, toys that light up or make noise (with extra batteries), Slinky®, writing pads or paper, coloring and picture books, T-shirts, socks, ball caps; sunglasses, hair clips, toy jewelry, watches, flashlights (with extra batteries).] **DO NOT INCLUDE:** Used or damaged items; war-related items such as toy guns, knives or military figures; chocolate or food; liquids or lotions; vitamins; breakable items such as snowglobes or glass containers; aerosol cans.

Be sure to be in prayer for the child receiving the box you prepare. (Your simple gifts can **impact lives forever!**) Also include a picture with your names and contact info so we may try to help the children communicate with you too! (Wrap lids separately—boxes may be inspected at the border.)

SEATS – Over the past couple of years, **Reto** a la Juventud Teen Challenge Centers in Juarez have been growing a church for the residents, families, and friends of the men and women in the programs. This has been so successful that they have **a need for 100 folding chairs** and a number of other items for the church and for the centers (see list of donation requests on p.9). We need your help in donating a folding chair, or \$10 for a chair; or any other items from the list; and filling a **shoebox** with toiletries for a man or woman in the Reto programs!

Rodolfo reports from Mexico City:

We have rented a place for the ministry! (This colonia we're in is one of the most troubled in the city.) We looked at other places for \$1,100 a month or more. Finally we found a **Christian lady** who normally would charge \$670 but has decided to rent to us for **\$335** a month. This is still beyond what we can really afford at this time, but you're not going to find any better deal! We have been doing the leadership training sessions and are just now kicking off the regular **Celebrate Recovery** meetings as well as Sunday services, and a cell group meeting during the week! (On top of the rent, we still need to purchase chairs and many other items.)

Business is slow with trying to get things rolling as an **optometrist**. Although I've received all the training and have all the basics, I still need to locate additional places where I can regularly set up my **portable office**. (I'm using the location we've rented, but we really need to have other locations as well; it's challenging. **Blessings and Greetings! Thank You for Everything!**)

November trip agenda:

We have received some funds designated for **building two more sewing tables** for the new machines at **Reto!** The Alm family is preparing to head to the border to build the two tables; on their way to spend some time in the **Sierra**. In Madera they plan to rally as many of the local pastors as possible and start arranging some **ongoing teaching/training seminars** to be held at their churches on a rotational basis. We want to help coordinate bringing in experts from all kinds of areas like: **Prayer, Woodworking, Bible Study, Health, Worship, Solar Collector production, Outreach, Alternative Energy (sources and practical application)**. They'll also be cleaning and painting - getting set up in their location just north of Madera. The **Grace Place** team plans to join them; bringing the Christmas gifts for the church in Madera, and just spending some time getting to know the new pastor and his family.

Mike and Nancy Jinnette plan to come along as well and then go with the Alms on down to **Guachochi** to deliver Christmas Blessing Boxes and spend some time with the Church there too. **What a Privilege it is to be a part of what God is doing!**
